Eligibility

At the time of application, candidates must be enrolled or be planning to enrol full-time in a PhD at a New Zealand university in a field relevant to the study of countering and preventing terrorism and violent extremism. The Research Committee reserves the right to determine the eligibility of a particular area of study.

A thesis of at least 75,000 words (including scholarly apparatus) must be completed as part of the doctoral programme, together with a short policy brief, article or other appropriate mechanism for enabling broad understanding of the research findings.

We welcome the scholarship of all, including those from non-dominant ethnicities, faiths and religions, genders, sexualities, ability status, ages, and the intersections of these identities.
